PITZHANGER MANOR

Pitzhanger Manor was the country home of Sir John Soane, one of the most influential architects in British History. Pitzhanger is unique because Soane designed, built and lived in it, from 1804, with his wife Eliza and dog Fanny, until 1810. During the 20th century Pitzhanger was a library. Following a four-year conservation project, Pitzhanger Manor and Gallery reopened in March 2019.

INSTRUCTIONS

Cut out all shapes and score lines. Fold both halves of the MAIN BUILDING into place and glue TABs G to the other half of the Manor. Fold ROOF TAB's. Glue TAB's A,B,C & D to inside of MAIN BUILDING. Fold GLASS PORCH into place. Glue TABS E and F to areas marked.
